Last week, students in Years 3-10 completed their Spring MAP Growth tests in

Mathematics, Reading, and Language Usage. We are preparing the reports to share with home and have started analysing the results in our staff meetings. One of the ways we learn from the data is by reviewing the percentage of students who meet their "growth projections" since the last test. We are mindful that students can have an off day, these tests should be considered alongside the assessments from their classes, but still we always want every student showing growth from one test to the next. Using the data, teachers can dig deep into the results for each individual student in order to target instruction in the areas where knowledge and skills are in need for development. Thank you to those who were able to join us for the **Health, Safety, and Safeguarding Parent Workshop** this week. Guiding the main points of discussion we addressed four key policies that guide our practice: i) Health and Safety, ii) Safeguarding, iii) Child Protection, iv) Bullying Prevention and Intervention. Discussion included:

- the key role of leadership and teachers in building a Safe School Culture
- the need to prevent and reduce risk while supporting play, adventure, and risk-taking
- the role of training, monitoring, risk assessments, and emergency preparedness
- medical procedures, the school nurse, and emergency contacts
- the value of first aid training for staff and of teaching students essential skills
- planning for extreme weather, air quality, sun protection, and using hazardous materials
- · learning from incidents and all "near-misses" to predict and prevent
- safeguarding by pursuing student best interests and protecting from harm
- · safe recruitment practices when hiring teachers and staff

- the role student and staff codes of conduct, digital safety, data protection
- the role of Dr. Lana as the Child Protection Officer


