### APPROACHES TO LEARNING in the MYP

When adults reflect back on their school experience, they often feel a tinge of uneasiness and maybe terror. The images of late-night test cramming and survival of countless instruction send an unpleasant shiver down their spine. Most of them come from traditional education systems which focus on transfer of content rather development of students as life-long learners. International Baccalaureate programmes are designed to facilitate the growth of young individuals in a holistic way. One of the tools to reach that goal is the use of Approaches to Learning (ATL) framework.

ATL skills are the foundation of any learning. They are comprised of Communication, Collaboration, Self-Management, Reflection and Thinking, all of which are instrumental in acquisition of new knowledge and skills. In order to ensure the best results, these general skills are broken down into very specific practices. For example, Self-Management category consists of three clusters:

- Organization
- Affective Skills
- Reflection

Each MYP school designs its own ATL chart to foster the growth of all skills throughout the five years of the programme. Subject teachers collaborate in


order to provide students with opportunities to ensure the balanced development of each and every skill.

At ZIS we strive to include the ATLs in every key assessment. Instead of merely testing students on raw content, we encourage them to think in a creative and interdisciplinary way. Take a look at last month's MYP Music submission by Year 10 Gyu-In. Her design of a new instrument is not only aesthetically pleasing but integrated a lot of Thinking and Collaboration skills.

It is our hope that when Gyu-In reaches adulthood, she will reminisce of meaningful learning experiences that have contributed to her personal growth. We believe that the development of ATL skills is the best way to prepare students for their future careers and challenges.
