
Health and safety remain a top priority for our students and staff. Parent support of our community is important as well, and so if you have any observations, comments, or questions to share please reach out.


Book Week: Just Read!

Dear Parents and Students,

American Mathematics Competition (AMC), organized by *Mathematical Association of America* (MAA) is widely recognized by well-known universities from around the world, especially universities in the USA.

AMC 8 was held in January for students Years 9 and below. AMC 10 was held in November for students in Year 11 and below while AMC 12 is for students in Years 12 and 13.

AMC not only tests students' knowledge and ability in Math, more importantly, students are encouraged to finish all questions within limited time, which requires students be familiar enough with questions and manage their time and stay focused. Competition problems are designed to challenge while connecting to middle school Mathematics standards to ensure they are within the reach of students. Students who take the AMC have the opportunity to develop critical and creative thinking skills, which better prepares them to succeed in college Math classes. Furthermore, Mathematics drives the innovations that shape our society and is useful in a broad range of careers, even those that are not traditionally mathematical, scientific, or technological in nature.

The AMC 8 training takes place every other Fridays and aims to help students practice the types of questions that frequently appear at the competitions such as those related to sequencing, permutations, probability, geometry and physics. They learn to answer questions efficiently while holding their curiosity and keeping minds sharp.


In the 2022 fall semester, ZIS will organize more intensive training for AMC 8 and AMC 10, in order to prepare students for the upcoming tests in November 2022 and in January 2023. Students with high enough scores in AMC 10 are invited to attend AIME, which is a benefit to college application.
