From the First Floor

Dear ZIS Community,

I am thankful for the minimal impact this week's typhoon had on campus and the city, I trust you were all safe and sound while the wind and rain passed through. We're all very pleased to be back on campus today, browsing the Book Fair, and wrapping up the week's studies, week 10 of the first semester.

You may have heard of the prominent educator, author, and founder of Harvard's Change Leadership Group, Tony Wagner. You don't need to be a teacher to enjoy his 2012 book 'Creating Innovators' where he shares the need for young people to be prepared for an innovation-driven economy. Gaining an understanding of young innovators, their families, and their schools, he discovers a pattern in their lives where a childhood of creative play leads to deep-seated interests which then evolve into a sense of deep purpose and career and life goals.

What Wagner learns about the school experiences of these innovators encourages reflection on our own practices. Time and time again these young

people describe learning environments where collaboration, interdisciplinary problem solving, and intrinsic motivation are given prominence. As an IB school that prizes student agency, real-world problem solving, service learning, and collaborative learning spaces, we want to ask how we can further advance how students see themselves as innovators where they are agents of change, transforming either society or technology, or both.

When designing learning experiences for ZIS students, our teachers ask themselves key questions:

- How will students be led to wonder, question, or experience awe and amazement?
- Where is there opportunity for students to express themselves, to flex their creativity, and to test ideas?
- In what ways is there space to shift initiative toward the student, where is there room for choice, how can they drive this investigation?
- How can I facilitate and guide the learning, opening as many doors as possible, while also ensuring student growth?

These types of questions engage students in the inquiry cycle of learning. Answering these questions successfully sets our students on the pathway to being lifelong learners, equipped to be innovators today and tomorrow.

I encourage you to locate a copy of Wagner's book. A parent can gain as much as a teacher from his stories and his findings. He has an engaging voice and shares a number of interesting case studies where young people followed their passions to make change happen.

HALLOWEEN brought by Friends of ZIS!




