#### APPROACHES TO LEARNING

In this newsletter, I would like to share and explain a key feature of PYP: "Approaches to Learning (ATLS)."

We live in a rapidly developing world. Students have so many different methods of learning and accessing content, and it is for this reason that the IB has the ATLS. The IB says that "These skills are grounded in the belief that learning how to learn is fundamental to a student's education."

The ATLS are categorised into five different groups.

- 1) Thinking skills
- 2) Self-management skills
- 3) Social skills
- 4) Communication skills
- 5) Research Skills

By developing these five skills in our students, we hope that they view learning as something they do for themselves rather than reacting to a teacher's instruction.

In our PYP program at ZIS, we plan these ATL skills into our unit and lesson plans emphasising certain skills depending on the requirements of the unit. However, these skills are always present in learning. Students use their thinking skills in math class. Self-management skills in art to help clean up. Research skills in UOI to learn more about a specific subject leading onto communication skills where they present their learning to the class. And social skills at recess and PE, where they learn to work together and support each other. By developing these skills, students become life-long learners and will be successful in MYP, DP, and beyond.
