

WHAT OUR STUDENTS SAY ABOUT THE EXTENDED ESSAY

On September 30th we had a celebration of EE completion for the Year 13 students. The goal was to:

- Reward the Year 13 students for their hard work and get a much-needed reprieve from class work. Well done to all the students!
- Get the younger students to see that timely completion of the EE is important in the hope that this would motivate them for performance in the future.

The long-lasting impact of the Extended Essay is captured in many student reflections such as "the feeling of self-accomplishment will remain." For some, the Extended Essay "sparked an ongoing passion for research," but perhaps the most poignant remark shared by one of the student's reflection was that researching and writing the Extended Essay had revealed "that I am capable of more than I had ever imagined." One respondent emphasized the importance of being supported in this endeavour by the presence of a well-designed Extended Essay schedule.

Students have described their struggle with managing the Extended Essay in conjunction with their other DP responsibilities and requirements, but, with the benefit of hindsight, there was a lot to learn from itl

They have 'learned how to manage time in the context of a large project', and 'strengthened the skills of organization and time management'.


We would like to congratulate the students and encourage them work hard work on their IA's and wish them the best of luck in their studies.
