SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENTS: More than Exams

When people hear the word "Assessment", the first image that comes to mind is a large hall with stressed students working quietly on an exam. While exams do serve a purpose (occasionally), there are many other ways to assess students' understanding while making connections to real life.

This week brings the end of the first Unit of Inquiry. This week is an opportunity for students to show their understanding of their unit's Central Ideas. However, instead of doing an exam, students will show their learning in authentic situations. For example, our Year 3 students were learning about well-being. Our Year 3s will plan activities related to the different well-being areas they have studied. The teacher can assess the student's understanding by assessing the quality and effectiveness of their activity and how it relates to the well-being area. Our Year 6's unit was about how our appearance and behaviour reflects our personality, and people will have interpretations of this. For their assessment, they will perform a fashion show where they will show their personalities through their clothes and speak about the behaviours and associations that come from the outfit.

As you can see from these two examples, these assessments allow students to show their understanding in a way that has real-life connections, which further motivates the students and gives them more opportunities to explain their thoughts. And, most important, it is fun! (More fun than an exam anyways).
