- seeking ways to measure, assess, and further develop student's development of global citizenship and intercultural learning
- providing a culturally sensitive learning environment, employing culturally responsive pedagogy
- involving all stakeholders in adopting, supporting, and furthering our school mission to develop global citizens

With over 20 nationalities represented on campus and creative and passionate teachers from across the globe, we work toward these 7 outcomes, purposefully learning from each other with open-minds and a hunger to understand this world we call home.


