# **GFP XLAB China Laboratory Scientific Research Project: Replicating the Nobel Prize Series**

At the beginning of the summer vacation one of my classmates and I went to Guangzhou to participate in the scientific research project of GFP, the Nobel Prize series, launched by XLAB China Laboratory. This experimental and scientific research project was carried out at the National Research Institute of Synthetic Biology in Guangzhou. It mainly focused on the process of reproducing the green fluorescent protein (GFP) of the 2008 Nobel Prize in

chemistry. The aim was to help students develop the mindset and knowledge of biology, chemistry, physics and other disciplines.


The scientific research lasted for five days. During these five days, students started from the most basic understanding of the equipment of the laboratory and then grew from there. The process included 1-2 large-scale experiments of incubation, inoculation, transfer, or extraction per day. As a middle school student with great interest in biology and marine biology, I had full expectations for this project before I participated.

I started my five-day "intensive training" from the moment I arrived at the institute. All the students were divided into three groups based on the small game of guessing the instruments or basic knowledge points needed in the experiment. The teachers of the research institutes were responsible for the teaching and guidance of each team.

The five-day experiment included the extraction of GFP plasmid, the availability of E. coli competent cells, the use of gel electrophoresis, the transformation of plasmid into E. coli competent cells, the use of PCR technology, and the extraction of GFP protein. The whole process of scientific research consisted of six experiments. Finally, one millilitre of GFP green fluorescent protein was extracted and one graduation speech was implemented as the conclusion. Our team was the only team made up entirely of girls. The efficiency and tacit understanding of our team were consistent and sustained from the beginning until the end. In addition, our team leader had more experience and knowledge about the experimental subject, she has helped us a lot both academically and with our confidence. This scientific research project has opened up a brandnew knowledge realm and laid a certain foundation for my future study.
