




EXPRESSION CAN TAKE MANY FORMS


In the Artist Zone, these past few months, we have explored Visual and Performance Arts. Students have created self-portraits, using all sorts of materials, from paper to plastic to Line designs! We have explored techniques such as, paper mâché, mosaics, transferring, designing, and clay sculpture. In this unit, students are learning about textiles, through weaving beads, making coasters, and making their own paper. Art does not have to be drawn or painted; it can also be performed, as the Year 4, 5, and 6 had shown us in our creation of, "Saving the Banyan Tree." Students had worked on this play since the previous year. They had created the story to script. They envisioned the stage and designed the scenery. They had learned how to make props and built a few. 


AMC 8 IMPRESSIONS

In January, I took the AMC 8 test. AMC 8's full name is the American Mathematics Competition. This is a competition that needs a lot of experience with mathematics questions. It only gives us 40 minutes to do, and there are 25 difficult multiple-choice questions. I used more than fifty hours and ten days for practising the AMC past papers. I gave myself a timer of 40 minutes and completed what I could. Afterwards, I checked how many were correct and how many were incorrect. Then, I always asked my dad to help me solve all the problems that were incorrect. I used this cycle every day until the test date. After I received the score, I thought that if I did not practise the papers and have classes, I would not have 16 answers correct.
